The Global South Studies program (<https://globalsouth.ucsd.edu/>) within the Institute of Arts and Humanities (<http://iah.ucsd.edu/>) at the University of California San Diego is committed to academic excellence and diversity within the faculty, staff, and student body and invites applications for part-time lecturers to teach one or more lower division courses in academic year 2022-23. Three courses are open: one GSS 20 "Introduction to Global South Studies" and two of the GSS 21-27 series. The GSS 21-27 series, currently titled "Literatures of the Global South," is in the process of being retitled "History, Culture, and Politics of the Global South" and will include the following courses: GSS 21 "Africa: History, Culture, and Politics"; GSS 22 "Latin America and the Caribbean: History, Culture and Politics"; GSS 23 "East Asia: History, Culture, and Politics"; GSS 25 "Middle East: History, Culture, and Politics"; GSS 26 "South Asia: History, Culture, and Politics"; and GSS 27 "Southeast Asia: History, Culture, and Politics".

Qualified candidates must have a PhD from a Humanities or Social Sciences discipline and a teaching and research focus on one or more regions of the Global South. Candidates must also have two or more years of experience teaching undergraduates as the instructor of record or Teaching Assistant.

Please submit a CV, student evaluations from one course, and a teaching statement. Please describe any teaching strategies you currently use or plan to use to foster a diverse and inclusive learning experience, and to enable all students to excel and fully participate in the learning process. The cover letter should include a paragraph on the proposed topic and a short description of the material to be covered.
